## East Renfrewshire Council Civic Government (Scotland) Act 1982

## CONDITIONS REGARDING PARADES/PROCESSIONS

- 1. Twenty Eight days' intimation shall be given to the Council of the intention to hold a procession.
- 2. Sufficient stewards and marshals shall be present to ensure that participants comply with directions. This should be no less than 1 steward for every 10 participants.
- 3. Stewards and marshals shall be easily identifiable.
- 4. The Organiser shall identify himself to the Police Officer in charge at the commencement of the procession.
- 5. The processionists, including marshals, shall not march more than four abreast and shall keep to the near or left hand side of the street except one-way streets where they will keep to the right hand side.
- 6. The procession shall be split into sections in order to avoid serious dislocation of traffic.
- 7. The band or bands taking part shall cease to play when approaching and passing places of worship irrespective of whether a service is in progress.
- 8. No halberds or weapons of any description shall be carried.
- 9. No cause for complaint shall be given.
- 10. No obstruction shall be caused.
- 11. The instructions of the Police shall be obeyed.
- 12. The conditions of Section 62 of the Control of Pollution Act 1974 in relation to the use of loudspeakers shall be observed.
- 13. The terms of the Public Order Act 1936 in relation to the prohibition of the wearing of uniforms signifying association with any political organisations, etc. shall be observed.
- 14. No band shall play before 9.00am or later than 6.00pm.
- 15. Organisers shall assist the Police in ensuring that passage is allowed for traffic and pedestrians.
- 16. The organisers shall be responsible for ensuring that these conditions are brought to the notice of persons, bodies and bands participating.
- 17. No return processions to be permitted.
- 18. Processions only permitted to take place between the hours of 7.30am and 9.00pm
